

# RCSEng Rep REPORT    BAPS Executive Meeting 18th July 2017

## 1. Paediatric Critical Care and Specialised Surgery in Children Review

The Expert Stakeholder Panel met on the 6<sup>th</sup> of July when a preliminary analysis for Specialised Paediatric Surgery was presented. The data was felt to be of poor quality due to poor coding and the inclusion of non-surgical procedures. A revised analysis method was agreed which will be presented at the next expert panel on the 13<sup>th</sup> of September.

Models of Care and Workforce workstreams are to continue over the summer, with a possible public consultation in late 2017.

It is anticipated that the reviews recommendations will be used for commissioning in September 2018 for implementation in 2019.

## 2. 5 Year Strategy for improving the local delivery of GPS

This document has been renamed – ‘Working together to improve the local delivery of General Paediatric Surgery – Statement of Intent’ & is aimed nationally.

I expect The Surgical Forum of Great Britain & Ireland, the FSSA, the RCPCH, BAUS, BAPS and the APA to endorse the document.

In the Autumn Jackie Cornish plans to take the finalised document to NHSE Policy/Strategy and NHSI.

Will BAPS endorse it and add their logo?
