Prof.dr.Peter John Kuijter was born at Amsterdam April 7th, 1921. He studied medicine at Leiden and Amsterdam Universities and qualified January 17th, 1947 (Leiden). During 1947 and 1948 he worked in the Pathology-Department of Amsterdam University (Prof.dr.H.T.Deelman) and presented his thesis on 'The tubercle, its conception in history' on July 1st, 1948. During 1948 and 1949 he served in the army. From 1950 till 1957 he was trained in surgery by Prof.dr.I.Boerema at the Academic 'Wilhelmina' Hospital at Amsterdam and developed a special interest in gastro-intestinal-, thoracic- and pediatric surgery and the history of medicine. In 1957 he was appointed Head of the Department of Surgery of the Municipal Hospital at the Hague. He worked there for nine years. In 1966 he was asked to take the chair of Professor of General Surgery and Director of the Department of Surgery of the University Hospital in Groningen. His special interests were abdominal surgery, endocrine surgery, organ-transplantation, neonatal surgery, the history of medicine and undergraduate teaching. He joined the BAPS in 1969. 21 Theses were prepared under his supervision. He published 98 articles and wrote two books: a pocketbook on physical diagnosis for students (which went through 4 editions) and a book on surgery for nurses (8 editions). He was on the Editorial Board of the Dutch Journal of Surgery for 20 years, of which 7 years as Chief-Editor. He was Consultant of the World Journal of Surgery for 15 years. He was President of the Dutch Society of Surgery in 1977 and 1978 and vice-president for Europe at the congress of the International Society of Surgery in Sidney 1986. He is a honorary member of the Dutch, German and Polish Societies of Surgery and of the 1921 Surgical Club of Great-Britain'. After his retirement in 1986 he was asked by the Faculty of Medicine of Groningen University to lecture on the history of medicine. For his work in this field he was awarded the Faculty-Teaching-Prize in 1990.
